### **GLENS FALLS' MAYOTTE SELECTED NYCBL COACH OF THE YEAR**

**SYRACUSE, N.Y.** – The New York Collegiate Baseball League announced today that John Mayotte, head coach of the Glens Falls Golden Eagles, has been named the 2007 NYCBL Coach of the Year.

Mayotte's Golden Eagles tied a modern-day league record for regular season victories, set a modern-day league record for winning percentage, won the Eastern Division championship and appeared in the NYCBL Championship Series. Glens Falls finished the regular season with a league-best 34-6 record and an .850 winning percentage. The Golden Eagles' 34 wins tied the modern-day (post-2000) league record for victories in a regular season that was set by the 2005 Hornell Dodgers.

Glens Falls' .850 winning percentage during the regular season was the highest in the NYCBL and the best among 71 teams affiliated with the National Alliance of College Summer Baseball (NACSB). The previous highest winning percentage in the NYCBL in the modern era (post-2000) was held by Mayotte's 2004 Golden Eagles with a .756 winning percentage.

The appearance in the NYCBL Championship Series by the Golden Eagles was the first in the four-year history of the franchise.

In four years with Glens Falls, Mayotte has compiled a 101-67 (.601) regular season record. Mayotte won his 100th NYCBL game as a manager on July 27 as the Golden Eagles defeated the Bennington Bombers, 5-3, in front of a season-high crowd of 853 at East Field in Glens Falls, N.Y.

The Hudson Falls, N.Y., native is the only manager in Glens Falls' franchise history. His Golden Eagles have won two Eastern Division regular season titles and twice won 30 games or more during the NYCBL regular season. Fourteen of Mayotte's former players in Glens Falls are currently playing professional baseball.

Prior to joining the Golden Eagles, Mayotte enjoyed great success as a collegiate head coach at Eckerd College and Troy State University, winning over 800 games.

The New York Collegiate Baseball League, founded in 1978, is a summer wood-bat league sanctioned by the National Alliance of College Summer Baseball (NACSB) and partially funded by Major League Baseball. The league gives college players who have not yet signed a professional contract the opportunity to develop their skills at a high level of play, gain experience with wood bats and be evaluated by professional scouts.
